SCHEDULE

The power to

- 1. determine any issue;
- 2. take any action; or
- do any act or thing

arising out of or connected with any duty imposed, or function or power conferred on Council by or under any Act.

Conditions and Limitations

The delegate must not determine the issue, take the action or do the act or thing

- 1. if the issue, action, act or thing is an issue, action, act or thing which involves:
- entering into a contract or making an expenditure exceeding the value of \$1 million (including GST),000,000; unless the contract, purchase or payment has been previously approved by resolution of Council, a delegated committee, or under other delegations (for example, regular payroll payments to employees);
 - awarding a contract or approving a purchase or payment exceeding the value of \$1 million (including GST) unless the contract, purchase or payment relates to statutory charges such as superannuation, taxation, Fire Rescue Victoria levy and insurance charges generally consistent with the approved or revised or budget; insert any situations where expenditure exceeds the above amount and include the amount it must not exceed (e.g. for certain insurances, fire services property levy, etc);

- 1.3 appointing an Acting Chief Executive Officer for a period exceeding 28 days;
- 1.21.1 insert any situations where expenditure exceeds the above amount and include the amount it must not exceed (e.g. for certain insurances, fire services property levy, etc):

- 3. if the issue, action, act or thing is an issue, action or thing which Council has previously designated as an issue, action, act or thing which must be the subject of a Resolution of Council:
- 4. if the determining of the issue, taking of the action or doing of the act or thing would or would be likely to involve a decision which is inconsistent with a
- 4.1 policy; or
- 4.2 strategy
 - adopted by Council; or
- 5. if the determining of the issue, the taking of the action or the doing of the act or thing cannot be the subject of a lawful delegation, whether on account of s 11(2)(a)-(n) (inclusive) of the Act or otherwise; or
- 6. the determining of the issue, the taking of the action or the doing of the act or thing is already the subject of an exclusive delegation to another member of Council staff.
